The Job Project Worker for Co-production

Main Purpose To work as a member of the team to deliver the National Lottery Helping Working Families co-production project engaging and empowering people who volunteer their time and talents within a co-production method of working.

Main Tasks

1. Project Delivery

- To support the Project Co-ordinator to develop the Project yearly action plan.
- To support the Project Co-ordinator in organising community consultations to gather information to guide the project programmes ensuring they are tailored according to community requirements.
- To support the Project Co-ordinator in liaising with Valleys Kids Community and Family Hubs to ensure the programmes are tailored according to community requirements.
- To arrange with other agencies when they are required for the delivery of sessions.

2. Support Families

- To ensure that all participants engaged in the Project are made to feel welcome

THE VISION

Valleys Kids will be a celebration of the achievement of people who, through trying different activities and having new experiences, broaden their horizons and achieve their potential.

THE MISSION

WHERE IS THE PROJECT?

Valleys Kids works mainly throughout the County Borough of Rhondda Cynon Taff and in the Valleys of South Wales. The area suffers high levels of deprivation with high numbers of unemployed, high levels of lone parent households, very high levels of debilitating long-term illness and large numbers of non-earning families.

It includes some of the most deprived areas in Wales. In spite of these difficulties there is a strong sense of community and belonging typical of the valleys. It is the place where most of the people want to live. The majority have long-standing roots in the area and a great commitment to it.

VALLEYS KIDS 1977 - PRESENT

Valleys Kids is a registered charity. It was established in 1977 as Penygraig Community Project and has worked to release the potential within communities to help counteract the effects of social deprivation and enable people to grow as individuals and to find solutions to problems in their community. The Community and Family Hubs provide pre-school, out of school play sessions, youth clubs, 16+ groups, drama workshops, youth theatre, children's creative dance, theatre, music and dance events.

As well as the four Community and Family Hubs there is a Youth Arts Project, a Future Families Project, a Hub for the Arts and Culture and a Residential Centre. Local Authority, Assemble Government, Arts Council of Wales, Trusts, Business and Individuals

support the work of the organisation.

Valleys Kids won a British Urban Regeneration Association Award in November 2007.

In 2018, We celebrated our 40th birthday with an array of events for our staff, volunteers and communities.

2020 was our toughest year to date but successful fundraising allowed us to deliver 2000+ essential food, care and play packs for families
